Morphology -

Cissus quadrangularis is a herb, reaching a height of 1.5 m and has quadrangular-sectioned branches with internodes 8 to 10 cm long and 1.2 to 1.5 cm wide.

- Stems - leafless, quadrangular, glabrous,
- Tendrils - long, slender, simple
- Leaves - 2.5-5 cm, broadly ovate, sometimes 3-7 lobes. Petioles 6-12 mm
- Flowers are cymes, Calyx cup shaped
- Berry ovoid, 6 mm long, red when ripe, seeded.
- Flowering and fruiting post rainy season, autumn.
