**7. Information regarding Ombudsperson and Student Grievance Redressal Committees**

The University shall prominently publish on its website and the prospectus all relevant information in respect of the Student Grievance Redressal Committee(s) under its purview, and the Ombudsperson for the purpose of appeal (s)

**8. Group Grievance Redressal**

Redressal of Group grievances may pertain to the following:

- (a) Group grievances lodged together by several students shall be referred to the Head of the Department who will try and resolve the matter within a period of one week.
- (b) In case the students are not satisfied with the decision of the Head of Department, students may approach the Admission and Facilitation Cell for its consideration.
- (c) If the grievance remains unresolved within two weeks from the day the grievance was lodged with the Admission and Facilitation Cell, an appeal may be made to the Vice-Chancellor, who will try to resolve the matter.

The Decision of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final and binding.

**10. Redressal of Grievances related to the Accounts, Library, Hostels, Food, Maintenance, Sports and Security, etc.:**

- (a) The grievances pertaining to the Accounts Branch, Library, Hostels, Food, Maintenance, Sports, Security and related issues shall be lodged with the respective administrative Head/in-charge. The Heads shall personally look into the grievance(s) and settle it within a period of one week.
- (b) If a resolution is not provided within the said timeline; the student may approach the Admission and Facilitation Cell who will try to get the issue(s) resolved in a week's time.
- (c) If the matter remains unresolved after approaching the Facilitation Cell, the students may make an appeal to the Registrar who shall try to resolve the matter within a period of one week.
- (d) The decision of Registrar shall be final and binding.

**13. ESTABLISHMENT OF COLLEGES/ CENTRES/ DEPARTMENTS**

- a. The University shall have such Colleges of Studies, Special Centres and Specialized

- Laboratories as may be approved by the Executive Council.
- b. The University shall have the following Colleges, namely:
- i. College of Agricultural Sciences
  - ii. College of Allied Health Sciences
  - iii. College of Architecture & Planning
  - iv. College of Basic Sciences & Research
  - v. College of Business Studies
  - vi. College of Dental Sciences
  - vii. College of Education
  - viii. College of Engineering & Technology
  - ix. College of Humanities & Social Sciences
  - x. College of Law
  - xi. College of Media, Film & Entertainment
  - xii. College of Medical Sciences & Research
  - xiii. College of Nursing Science & Research
  - xiv. College of Pharmacy
- c) Every College of Studies (here in after referred to as the College) shall consist of such Departments as may be assigned to it with the approval of the Executive Council.
- d) Each College/Centre/ Department shall have a Dean/ Director/ Head of the Department, respectively.
- e) Deans, Directors, and Head of Departments shall be appointed and perform functions as per the provisions in Section 10, 12, and 16 of the Statutes respectively.
- f) Every College shall have a Faculty Board (College Board) and each Department shall have a Board of Studies in accordance with Section 25 and 26 of the University Statutes.

#### Establishment of Special University Units

On the recommendations of the Academic Council, the Executive Council may establish Special Centre's and Specialized laboratories for undertaking Interdisciplinary and Special Studies Programmes including Centres of Excellence, Centres of Studies, Special Centres, Inter-disciplinary Studies, Specialized Laboratories, etc. The Executive Council may also constitute Special Board(s) of Studies and academic committee(s) for their guidance.

**Subject: Assessment of Annual Declaration Form and  
grant of Renewal of Undergraduate seats (MBBS) for the  
year 2024-25 - regarding.**

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to convey that all medical colleges/Institutes with valid Letters of Permission (LoP) for MBBS admission must upload details/data on the NMC portal for the Annual Declaration as per the NMC Act 2019 requirements and other relevant regulations. Accordingly, Public notices have been issued, and colleges/Institutions were directed to submit the details on the portal.

2. The experts assessed the details submitted by your college, and accordingly, your college was issued a show cause notice containing the details of deficiencies observed by the experts while evaluating the annual declaration form, video of examination, and SAF-C provided by your college along with the AEBAS report.

3. Vide the above show cause notice issued to your college, it was directed to furnish the point-wise reply within three days (3 days) of issuance of show cause as to why the seats allocated to your institution for MBBS not be reduced in A-Y 2024-25, or should a monetary penalty as per the regulations not be imposed as your college has not fulfilled the provisions laid down under NMC Act 2019 and other relevant guidelines, regulation notified by NMC.

  
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Further, vide the above show cause notice issued, your medical college/institute was given an additional opportunity to present the explanation on the observations, if any, through the virtual hearing before the Undergraduate Medical Education Board.

4. In the above virtual hearing conducted on 10.06.2024, in which your college was represented by the Dean of the college. In this hearing, the competent authority reviewed the observations by the assessor, and have found the breaches to be substantial, and the clarification provided by your college was found to be unsatisfactory. While this Board recognize that your college has accepted its justifications have not addressed concerns raised and has assured of addressing the same at the earliest. Not on-boarded on AEBAS portal directly prevents the UGMEB to assess the available number of Faculties to teach students.
5. For effective and convenient digital solution to recording the attendance of faculties, Senior Residents and Tutors of Medical Colleges, Biometric Attendance System has been introduced. Here, it is pertinent to reiterate that the medical colleges/institutes were first intimated for implementation of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System (AEBAS) vide NMC letter dated 01<sup>st</sup> August, 2022 through Public Notice uploaded on the website of the Commission. Further, implementation of AEBAS and its module were also made available to all Medical Colleges/Institutes vide various circulars/public notices available on the NMC website and show cause notices stating to initiate action to fulfill the provisions laid in various regulations and guidelines by NMC.
6. The competent authority is of the view that in all respect your college becomes the fit case for reduction of seats due to non-adherence of guidelines, regulations notified and issued by NMC from time to time. Since the portal for submission of the Annual Declaration Form has been introduced for first time, taking a lenient view, the Board decided to grant renewal of 150 seats for undergraduate (MBBS) for the year 2024-25, subject to deposit of a fine of Rs.15,00,000/- (Rupees Fifteen lacs only) as a first measure; however, a reassessment will be done after one (01) month. If deficiencies exist with your college, this organization initiates the stringent action as mandated under MSMER-2023 Chapter-III clause-8 and any other relevant act and rules.
7. As per, it is directed to remit the penalty amount within Seven days (7 days) into "NMC Own Resources, Canara Bank Account No. 90682160000025, IFSC code CNRB0019109 and forward confirmation of payment along with transaction details to ug.scn@nmc.org.in.
8. If you are not satisfied and aggrieved with the decision of the

  
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Board, you are free to prefer an appeal before the Commission under Section 9, Chapter IV of the Maintenance of Standards of Medical Education Regulations, 2023, (MSMER, 2023) within Sixty (60) days of the issue of this letter.

**Subject:-** Grant of Conditional Permission to SKS Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, NH-2, Village-Chaumuhan, Distt- Chhata Mathura-281406, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID. AYU0445) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely SKS Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, NH-2, Village-Chaumuhan, Distt- Chhata Mathura-281406, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID. AYU0445), inspection of your College was conducted on 11.03.2024 & 12.03.2024 on hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional permission with Intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.
2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education regulation, 2022 provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
3. Therefore, the assessment report was placed in the 91<sup>st</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 24.05.2024 and it was found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 and the Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to your college. Thereafter, an opportunity of hearing was granted to your college on 07.06.2024 to present the case through virtual mode.

  
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4. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representative during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education regulation, 2022 and relevant regulations thereunder, and the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 93<sup>rd</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 13.06.2024 & 14.06.2024. On careful examination the Board found that **your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, due to the following shortcoming:**

- a) Shalakyia OT is not working as per the records.
- b) Ksharasutra cabinet is not present in Shalya department.
- c) As per the record very less labour procedures were conducted in the labour room.
- d) Clinical Laboratory, labour room & Panchkarma block are non-functional.

5. However, as per regulation 3(3) of MSR, 2016, the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for conditional permission for the academic year 2024-25. Hence the Board decided to issue the conditional Permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 with a warning with regard to aforementioned shortcomings.

6. Therefore, Conditional Permission is granted to SKS Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, NH-2, Village-Chaumuhan, Distt- Chhata Mathura-281406, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID. AYU0445) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 along with a warning with regard to points (a),(b),(c), & (d) mentioned under Point no. 4 above, and subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following requirements: -

- I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.

- II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

8. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.

9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:

- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of Infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
  - The shortcoming mentioned in Point no. 4 above, should be fulfilled.

11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
