Subject:- Regularization of admission made by SKS Ayurvedic Medical College Hospital and Research Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id- AYU0445) as per the permissible intake capacity In UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2020-21, in compliance of the Court order dated 31.05.2023 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi In the W.P. (C) No. 3771 of 2021-reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am to refer to the Ministry's order ref. no. L-14014/23/2020-EP- 1, dated 02.02.2021 vide which conditional permission of your college was denied to take admission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under Section 13C of IMCC Act, 1970 and concerned regulations thereunder, for the academic session 2020-21.

Further, you challenged the aforesaid Ministry's order ref. no. L-14014/23/2020-EP- 1, dated 02.02.2021 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and filed W.P.(C) No. 1539 of 2021. In accordance with the order of TheHon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P (CW) 2110/2021 & connected matters with W.P.(C) No. 1539 of 2021, an opportunity of hearingwas granted to your college to clarify on the shortcomings mentioned in the denial letter dated 02.02.2021. Further, based on the hearing, conditional permission to conduct 30 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) course was issued section 13C of IMCC Act, 1970 and concerned regulations thereunder, for the academic session 2020-21 and the same was communicated to you vide letter ref no. L-14014/23/2020-EP- 1, dated 17.03.2021.

Further, aggrieved by the said order dated 17.03.2021, you filed another writ petition in WP (CW) No. 3771 of 2021 before Hon'ble Court of Delhiand Hon'ble Court of Delhi vide its final order disposed off the writ petition and set aside the above permission order dated 17.03.2021 passed by the Ministry of Ayush and in relevant para held as under:-

"42. In such circumstances, I am of the view that the petitioners can be granted a consequential order continuing the students who have already been admitted, but not to any further relief, whether by way of remand, further counseling, or otherwise.

43. In the light of the above, and following the decision of this Court in Anil Kumar Singh Bhadoria, the impugned decisions of the Union of India are set aside, and the petitioners are permitted to continue with the admission of the students who were admitted pursuant to the interim orders passed by this Court.

44. In the facts and circumstances of the case, no further relief is considered appropriate.

45. The writ petitions and all the pending applications are disposed of with these directions"

Accordingly, as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the aforesald matter was placed in the 69th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 07.11.2023 and Board decided to regularize the admission made by the SKS Ayurvedic Medical College Hospital and Research Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0445)as per the permissible intake capacity in UG (BAMS) course for the academic

session 2020-21, in compliance of Hon'ble High Court of Delhi order dated 31.05.2023 passed in W.P. No. 3771 of 2021.

Therefore, in compliance of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi order dated 31.05.2023 passed in W.P. No. 3771 of 2021, the admission made by SKS Ayurvedic Medical College Hospital and Research Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0445) is hereby regularized as per the permissible intake capacity in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2020-21. Hence, the earlier order of Ministry vide ref. no. L-14014/23/2020-EP- 1, dated 17.03.2021 for the academic session 2020-21 stands null and vold.
